# Condition of Watering in the Park

You may have noticed a certain lack of green around the community in our public areas this year. Just as we were starting this year, the governor's executive order went out with a set of restrictions on watering that affected all government agencies. This cut our watering by over two-thirds. Much of our grass slipped back into dormancy. The state has eased our restrictions considerably and we are in the process of bringing the grass out of dormancy. But this takes time. It takes at least two weeks to convince the grass that it is springtime again and it can take another two weeks for the grass to get up and running. This is where we are now. You should start seeing new sprigs shooting up in the yellow areas. This means the grass is recovering. You can do much to help us in this endeavor by resisting the urge to set up tents or blankets in the stressed-out areas because the grass needs sunlight. Additionally, please have your families not run carts or bikes across these areas to help them recover. If you see a roped-off area; please stay off of it. Everything you can do to help the grass recover will be much appreciated.
