Gardening Tips

Now is the time of year to start putting flower beds, lawns, and trees to bed for the season.

Cut out the dead material from your annuals and perennials to discourage mold and mildew from forming. Leave enough stubble on the perennials to identify them in the Spring.

Use a winterizer on the lawn to help repair stress damage and build new roots. And finally, take advantage of the skeletal shape of your trees to do corrective pruning.

It is also a great time to amend the soil and make changes in the beds while everything is dormant.

Don't forget to plant your bulbs before the ground freezes.

- Laying down weed stop fabric.
- Spreading cobble rock, cleaning headstones, and weeding around the flowers, and general maintenance.
