Lake Monitoring

Did you know that Stansbury Service Agency is monitoring water quality in the lake under the Utah Water Watch (UWW) program which is managed by USU? Water quality measurements and visual observations are taken between April and October. UWW volunteers make field observations about water appearance, temperature, pH, dissolved oxygen, and turbidity, as well as collect samples for E. coli bacteria. The data provides a baseline and helps identify water quality changes over time.

There are three monitoring points on Stansbury Lake: near the clubhouse (STL-01), Solomon Park (STL-02), and the causeway (STL-03). Data and observations are uploaded monthly to the CitSci.org website where you can view the data (Click "Projects" then "Utah Water Watch" and then filter for the sampling location "STL-XX").

Data collected so far in 2024 indicates that pH is near neutral, dissolved oxygen is within normal range, total dissolved solids remains high (naturally occurring), and water transparency/clarity which was low during the spring (i.e. as little as 18 inches) has improved through August (ranging from 30-52 inches). As you know, algae is observed throughout the lake; however, no Harmful Algal Blooms (HABs) have been observed. Similarly, E. coli has not been detected above reportable levels.
